Cooksey his executors, administrators and assigns the following property to wit: one negre woman named Milly and her four children, John, Sally, George and James, one or cart, one pair of oxen, three milch cows, two horses, three beds, two bedsteads one dozen Windsor chairs, one mahogany desk, two looking glasses, and all other the household and kitchen furniture and farming implements now in the possession of the said Richard S. Teyman. To Have and to Hold all and singular the above premises as bargained and sold or mentioned and intended so to be to the said William W. Cooksey his executors, administrators and assigns forever, - and I the said Richard S. Teyman for myself, my heirs, executors and administrators all and singular the above premises unto the said William W. Cooksey against me the said Richard S. Teyman my executors and administrators and against all and every other person or persons whatsoever shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents.
