

Samuel Day to Richard Crisp

This Indenture made this twenty fourth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty nine, between Samuel Day of Anne Arundel County in the state of Maryland of the one part and Richard Crisp of Anne Arundel County in the said state of the other part. Whereas the said Samuel Day owes and stands justly indebted to the said Richard Crisp in the sum of three hundred dollars current money and to secure the payment thereof is willing to execute these presents. Now this Indenture witnesseth that the said Samuel Day for and in consideration of the premises and of the sum of five dollars current money to him in hand paid by the said Richard Crisp at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, hath granted, bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant, bargain and sell unto the said Richard Crisp his executors administrators and assigns one negro man Jake for life. To Have and to Hold all and singular the said slave above bargained and sold unto the said Richard Crisp his executors, administrators and assigns to his and their own use and behoof. Provided always and it is declared to be the true intent and meaning of these presents that if the said Samuel Day do and shall well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the said Richard Crisp his executors, administrators or assigns the full sum of three hundred dollars current money with legal interest for the same, on or before the twenty fourth day of August eighteen hundred and fifty then in such case these presents and every matter and thing herein contained shall cease determine and be utterly void to all intents and purposes.
