

Now this Indenture witnesseth that for the better securing the payment of the sum of money of mentioned in the said bond or obligation, and also in consideration of the sum of five dollars in hand paid by the said Richard C. Mackubin at the time of sealing and delivering these presents, the said Charles F. Worthington hath granted, bargained and sold, transferred and conveyed and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell, transfer and convey unto the said Richard C. Mackubin his heirs and assigns the following negro slaves, negro man Tom Hanson aged about fifty five years, negro man Harry aged about forty five years, one negro man Davy Young aged about fifty years of age one woman Liz and three children, aged about thirty years, one woman Lily aged about twenty years, one man
