Mackubin his executors, administrators and assigns to his and their own use and behoof. Provided always and it is the true intent and meaning of these presents and of the parties hereunto that if the said Charles F. Worthington his executors or administrators do and shall well, well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the said Richard C. Mackubin his executors, administrators or assigns the said sum of two thousand five hundred and thirty dollars according to the terms and tenor of the bond, or obligation aforesaid then and in such case these presents and every matter and thing therein contained shall cease determine and be utterly void, anything herein contained to the contrary notwithstanding. In Testimony whereof, the said Charles F. Worthington hath hereunto set his hand and affixed his seal this twenty fourth day of March eighteen hundred and forty nine.
