


Joseph Owens & Know all men by these presents, that I Joseph Owens of Anne Arundel
 to County in the state of Maryland, for and in consideration of the sum
 of one hundred dollars current money to me in hand paid by
Wm H. Owens of the County aforesaid in the said state at and before
 the sealing and delivering of these presents, the receipt whereof I the said Joseph Owens
 do hereby acknowledge, have granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents do grant,
 bargain and sell unto the said William H. Owens, his executors, administrators and
 assigns, one negro girl named Ann Norman, alias Josephine, or by what name said
 girl may be called or known - To Have and to hold the said negro Ann Norman, alias
 Josephine above bargained and sold or mentioned and intended so to be to the said
 William H. Owens his executors, administrators and assigns forever. And I the said Joseph
 Owens for myself, my heirs, executors and administrators the said negro girl unto the
 said William H. Owens his executors, administrators and assigns, against me the said
 Joseph Owens, my executors and administrators and against all and every person or
 persons whatsoever, shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents; of the
 said negro, which said negro I the said Joseph Owens have put the said William H. Owens
 in full possession by delivering the said negro to him the said William H. Owens
 at the sealing and delivery of these presents. In Witness whereof I the said Joseph
 Owens have hereunto set my hand and seal this fifth day of April anno Domini
 one thousand eight hundred and forty nine.
