Lynch at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged hath granted, bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant, bargain, and sell unto the said Samuel D. Lynch his executors, administrators and assigns all and singular the goods, furniture and household stuff, stock &c hereinafter particularly mentioned and expressed, that is to say, one horse, one cow & home cart 2 Ploughs, lot corn, lot top fodder, 2 cultivators, 2 Battaes, one cupboard, one Book case & secretary one desk, 4 beds, one mantle clock 3 Hogs, 4 Cabbes, Kitchen furniture lot plough & cart harness, 4 axes lot crockery ware & looking glasses lot Pictures lot of Poultry 5 ducks, lot of Market pees, lot seed peas, lot potatoes lot one hog.
