Duvall, his executors administrators and assigns from the day of the date of these presents, until he the said Isaac Dorsey arrives at the age of thirty years, which will be on the first day of April 1864, as aforesaid, and no longer. And I the said Letitia Pearce

for myself my heirs, executors and administrators, the said negro boy Isaac Dorsey unto the said Marcen M. Duvall, his executors, administrators and assigns, for and during the period aforesaid, shall and will warrant and defend against the claims of all persons whomsoever, claiming by from or under me. And I the said Letitia Pearce for diverse

good causes and considerations me therunto moving do hereby release from slavery, liberate, manumit and set free, from and after he attains the age of thirty years, which will be on the first day of April eighteen hundred and sixty four as aforesaid, the said negro boy named Isaac Dorsey or by whatsoever name or names he may be known or called - And the said negro boy named Isaac Dorsey, I do by these presents declare to be thenceforth, that is to say, from and after the first day of April 1864 as aforesaid, free, manumitted and discharged from all manner of service or servitude to me my executors, or administrators, and from all manner of claim or right of service or servitude by me, my executors, or administrators forever.
