

Duvall his executors, administrators, and assigns forever, and I the said Justus Shook, for myself my heirs, executors and administrators, all and singular the said cattle and hogs, and other the premises unto the said R. S. Duvall, his executors, administrators and assigns, against me the said Justus Shook my executors, administrators and assigns and against all and every other person or persons whatsoever, shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents, all and every part and parcel of the property as above bargained and sold or mentioned, and intended to be so, unto him the said R. S. Duvall as aforesaid.

Waters now rented by me, and all my crop of Tobacco of the present years growth on said farms and now hanging in the Hous-
