


To Have and to Hold the same unto the said Edward Reynolds his executors, administrators and assigns In trust nevertheless that he and they shall and will as soon as convenient, may be, after the same shall have been by me cultivated, secured, prepared and sent to market, sell and dispose of said crops, and the net proceeds remaining after payment of all expenses attending the execution of this trust, apply to the payment of the said sum of money in said draft so to be accepted, specified as aforesaid, and any costs or expenses that may accrue on the same, and the surplus if any, shall remain, shall pay over to myself, my executors, administrators or assigns - And I do hereby covenant and agree to and with the said Edward Reynolds, that I, my executors, administrators shall and will use, all reasonable means dispatch and in proper season prepare, cultivate, harvest and secure said crops, and send the same to the City of Baltimore consigned to the said J. M. & E. Reynolds with directions and authority to sell and dispose of the same for the purposes aforesaid. In witness whereof here hereunto set my hand and seal this fourth day of December in the year eighteen hundred and forty nine.
