This Indenture made this twenty third day of October, in the year of our Lord, one thousand, eight hundred and fifty, between Beal Susby of Anne Arundel County, in the State of Maryland, of the one part, and Henrietta Gaither of the other part, sister of the said Beal Susby of the first part, Witnesseth, that the said Beal Susby, as well for, and in consideration of the natural love and affection, which he the said Beal Susby, hath and beareth unto the said Henrietta Gaither, as also for the better support, maintenance livelihood, and preferment of her the said Henrietta Gaither, hath given, granted, aliened, enfeoffed and confirmed, and by these presents doth give, grant, alien enfeoff and confirm unto the said Henrietta Gaither, her heirs and assigns, all of my right, title and interest in and to, two feather beds, and furniture, and all of my household and kitchen furniture, one red and white heifer, plantation, and two hogs, one horse cart, and one third of crop, to her the said Henrietta, and her heirs and assigns forever, reserving no right or title thereto, in any wise whatsoever. In testimony whereof, I the said Beal Susby have hereunto set my hand, and affixed my seal the day and year, first hereinbefore written
