 going bill of sale is true and bona fide.

 Thomas S. Brice & John Brice } William S. Holliday of Anne Arundel County and
 Mortgage of negroes } State of Maryland of the one part and Thomas S. Brice
 and John Brice of the City of Annapolis and State aforesaid of the other part
 whereas the said William S. Holliday once and stands justly indebted to the said
 Thomas S. Brice and John Brice in the sum of fifteen hundred dollars cur-
 rent money for which the said Holliday hath given his promissory note to wit
 Thomas S. Brice and John Brice written upon paper duly stamped as is re-
 quired by the laws of this State and bearing even date with these presents and
 payable at six months after date with interest thereon payable monthly, said
 note subject to renewals from one six months and to secure the payment thereof
 and of the said renewals if any be made with interest thereon as aforesaid he the
 said William S. Holliday is willing to execute these presents Now this indenture
 Witnesseth that the said William S. Holliday for and in consideration of the pre-
 mises and for and in consideration of the sum of five dollars current money
 to him in hand paid by the said Thomas S. Brice and John Brice at or before
 the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
 hath granted bargain and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and
 sell unto the said Thomas S. Brice and John Brice their executors administrators
 and assigns the following personally property to wit a negro man named Robert
 age about twenty four years. A negro named Henry age about fourteen years
 and a negro boy named John age about ten years all three for life to have
 and to hold all and singular the said negro slaves unto the said Thomas S. Brice
 and John Brice their executors administrators and assigns forever
 provided always and these presents are upon this condition that if the said
 William S. Holliday his executors or administrators shall and do make and
 truly pay or cause to be paid unto the said Thomas S. Brice and John Brice
