Clayton his executors or administrators shall and do well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the said Philip Clayton his executors or administrators no assigns the said sum of four hundred dollars current money with legal interest for the same or on before the first day of January next then and in such case these presents and every matter and thing herein contained shall cease and be utterly void to all intents and purposes any thing herein contained to the contrary thereof in any wise notwithstanding. This indenture made this
Eleventh day of August in
the year eighteen hundred
and forty five between Alexander
Randall of Anne Arundel

County of the one part and Matilda Watkins wife of John
Nicholas Watkins of the same County in the State of Maryland
of the other part. Whereas by a decree of the High Court of Chancery
of the State aforesaid bearing date the eighth day of February
in the year eighteen hundred and forty five passed in a cause
wherein the State of Maryland by the Attorney General is
complainant and the President Directors and Company of
the Farmers Bank of Maryland and others are defendants
the abovenamed Alexander Randall was appointed a trustee
and authorized and empowered to sell and dispose of certain
negro slaves for life in the proceedings in said cause mentioned
That in pursuance of the said decree the said Alexander Randall
hath sold and disposed of to the said Matilda Watkins
