

Bill of sale with a manumission  
 clause from Charles Waters of a negro  
 slave named Emeline to Rachel  
 Johnson dated the first day of August  
 eighteen hundred and forty five

Know all men by these  
 presents that I Charles  
 Waters of Baltimore County  
 in the State of Maryland  
 for and in consideration of  
 the sum of two dollars to me

in hand paid by Rachel Johnson Colored man of Anne Arundel  
 County and State aforesaid the receipt whereof is hereby acknow-  
 ledged have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do  
 grant bargain and sell unto the said Rachel Johnson his Executors  
 administrators and assigns my negro slave named Emeline aged  
 about four years. To have and to hold the said female slave  
 unto the said Rachel Johnson his executors administrators  
 and assigns from the day of the date of these presents until the  
 first day of August in the year eighteen hundred and sixty one  
 and no longer and he it further known that from and after  
 the said last mentioned day and to date and take effect from  
 and upon the same and not before thereby you do give good and suffi-  
 cient cause and considerations me thereto moving manumit  
 release from slavery and servitude liberate and set free the said  
 female slave named Emeline and her the said female slave  
 I declare to be thenceforth free manumitted and discharged  
 from all manner of service or servitude to me my executors  
 administrators and assigns. In witness whereof I hereunto  
 set my hand and seal this first day of August eighteen  
 hundred and forty five,
