Harwood for and in consideration of the above recited premises and of the sum of five dollars current money to him in hand paid by the said Battee & Lowe the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged the said Osborn S. Harwood hath granted conveyed and sold and by these presents doth grant convey and sell unto the said Richard H. Battee & William L. Lowe their executors administrators and assigns his entire crop of tobacco now hanging in the houses and growing on his farm called Cherry Hill in Anne Arundel County to have and to hold the said crop of tobacco above conveyed and sold aforesaid and intended to be to the said Richard H. Battee and William L. Lowe their executors administrators and assigns forever And the said Osborn S. Harwood for himself his executors and administrators the said crop of tobacco unto the said Richard H. Battee & William L. Lowe their executors administrators and assigns against him the said Osborn S. Harwood his executors and administrators and against all and every other person or persons whatsoever shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents.
