Bill of sale from William Maniott to Walter S. Clarke of negroes dated the twelfth day of January 1820. } Know all men by these presents that I William Maniott of Anne Arundel County and State of Maryland for the consideration of the sum of four hundred dollars current money to me in hand paid by Walter S. Clarke of Prince Georges County and State aforesaid the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge have granted bargained sold and delivered and by these presents do grant bargain sell and deliver unto Walter S. Clarke of Prince Georges County and State aforesaid my two negro Girls Betty Lemima to serve for ten years from the date hereof Mariah to serve twenty one years from the date hereof and their respective increase to serve as follows Boys to serve to thirty years old Girls to twenty eight years old said servants to will stand and depend to the said Walter S. Clarke his executors and administrators and against every other person or persons whomsoever. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my name and affixed my seal this the twelfth day of January eighteen hundred and twenty
