Elijah Gray of Ann arundel County in the State of Maryland, Planter for divers good causes and considerations me thereunto moving do hereby declare free manumit and enfranchise the two negroes following To wit, Daniel aged three years last August and Edmond aged one year next December to be free when they shall be thirty years of age, heily acknowledging the said negroes discharged from all claims of service and right of property whatsoever from me my heirs executors or administrators on the time above mentioned as witness my hand and seal this 19th day of January in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and Two, Signed Sealed and
