 concern, be it known that I John Quinn of the City
 of Annapolis in the State of Maryland for divers
 good causes and considerations me thereunto
 moving, as also in further consideration of
 five Shillings current money to me in hand
 paid, the receipt whereof I do hereby
 acknowledge, have released from Slavery,
 liberated, manumitted and set free, and
 by these presents do hereby release from
 Slavery, liberate, manumit and set free
 from and after the fifteenth day of March
 Eighteen hundred and six, my Mulatto
 Lad now in Baltimore named Matthias
 being of about the age of Twenty years
 and able to work and gain a sufficient
 livelihood and maintenance, (which
 said negro lad I sold to Mr. William Evans
 on the fifteenth day of March last for the
 Term of four years) and him the said
 Mulatto Lad named Matthias, I do hereby
 declare to be free manumitted and
 discharged after the fifteenth day of
 March Eighteen hundred and six, from
 all manner of servitude or service to
 me my executors or administrators
