Be it known to all whom it may concern, be it known, that I William Brown of Anne Arundel County, in the State of Maryland for divers good causes and considerations me thereunto moving as also in further consideration of the sum of five shillings current money to me in hand paid have released from slavery, liberated, manumitted and set free and by these presents do hereby release from slavery liberate manumit and set free my negro woman named Cassandra commonly called Milleg, being of the age of thirty years or thereabouts and able to work and gain a sufficient livelihood and maintenances and her the said negro woman named Cassandra and commonly called Milleg, I do declare to be henceforth free, manumitted and discharged, from all manner of servitude, or service to me my executors or administrators forever.
