

Negro boy named Toby aged fifteen to be free the first day of January 1806. one Negro Girl named Lylely aged ten years to be free the first day of January 1809 one Negro boy named Charles aged three years to be free the first day of January 1820. one Negro Girl named Artridge aged one year to be free the first day of January 1810 hereby Acknowledging the said Negroes Discharged from all Claim of Service or right of property whatever from me my heirs Executors or Administrators as witness my hand and Seal this 16 day of January 1790
