

Maryland Let Know all men by these presents that I John Thomas of Anne Arundel County in the State of aforesaid, for divers considerations me hereto moving, have manumitted and forever set free and discharged from all right, claim and demand whatever of me, my Heirs, Executors, Administrators or Assigns; and by these presents do manumitt, set free and discharged from me, my Heirs, Executors, Administrators and Assigns, a Negro Woman named Camilla and her five Children, to wit, Mary, Harriett, Tom, Peter, and William, and all her, and their future Issue: and I do from henceforth and for ever renounce all right whatever to them or to either of them.

Witness my hand and seal this seventh day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and four.
