


Es^d I William Ward of the State of Maryland and County of Anne Arundel do hereby set free from bondage, my negro woman named Charlott aged about sixteen years and do for myself, my executors and administrators release unto the said Charlott all my rights, and all claims whatsoever as to her person, or to any estate she may acquire hereby declaring the said Charlott absolutely free without any interruption from me, or any person claiming under me. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty sixth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and six.

good causes and considerations me thereunto moving
and also in further consideration of five shillings
currency to me in hand paid have released from
Slavery manumitted and set free the following negro
woman to wit, Rosetta Drummer aged forty four years
and do declare the said negro woman Rosetta Drum-
mer to be hence forth free, manumitted and discharged
from
