high and appears to be about forty years of age, he
is of a very bright complexion and was raised on
West River in the County of Anne Arundel he does
not appear to have any notable marks

hereby certify that it appears by a deed of manumission
executed by Joseph Senifer of the County of ... bearing date on the
thirty first day of July in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred & four
and recorded in one of the manumission books of Anne Arundel
County of ... that freedom was thereby granted unto a negro
woman by the name of Prip, which said freedom was to
take place from the date of the said manumission.

I further certify that a negro woman named Prip, now present
and who has made application to me for a certificate of her
freedom, has proved by testimony which is satisfactory to me
that she is the identical person who was manumitted by the
above mentioned deed of manumission, the said negro woman
named Prip is about five feet seven inches high and appears to
be about forty five years of age, she is rather a bright mulatto
& was raised on South River, in the County aforesaid.
