from Samuel Peaco to Sidney Negro, bearing date the twenty
first day of July in the year one thousand seven hundred &
seventy eight & recorded among the records of Ann Arundel County
Court that Negro Nell aged about eight years at the date of the
said Manumission was to be free at the age of twenty one
years that the said Negro Nell is about the age of thirteen
years at this time that she is about five feet high her
complexion black was raised at the head of South River
in the County of Queen Anne & said County made
both before Joseph Sanders Justice of the Peace for the
County advised that the said Negro Nell is the identical
person mentioned in the said Deed of Manumission
Given the 31st June 1806.

that it appears by a Deed of Manumission from Samuel Peaco
to Negro Grace bearing date the twenty the day of March
in the year one thousand seven hundred & seventy seven &
recorded among the records of Ann Arundel County Court that
the said Negro Grace aged about forty nine years at this
time was to be free from the date of the said Manumission
she is about five feet five inches high her complexion
black was raised in Ann Arundel County. Samuel Peaco
of said County made both before Gideon White a Justice of
the Peace for the County of Queen Anne that the said Negro
Grace is the identical person mentioned in the said Deed
of Manumission
