On the back of the foregoing was thus endorsed by
 Ann Arundell County to wit, Be it remembered that on
 the 26th day of Nov. 1800 in the year of our Lord
 eighteen hundred personally appeared before the
 subscriber one of the Justices of the peace for the said
 County the above mentioned Walter D. Addison re
 acknowledged the above Instrument of writing as
 his act and Deed according to the purposes therein
 mentioned
