

On the back of the above was thus endorsed by
Ann Arundel County etc. On the 22 day of May 1801.
Then came before us the subscribers two of the
Justices of the peace for the County aforesaid Benjamin
Pasford party to the above instrument of writing
and acknowledged the same to be his act & deed
for the purpose within mentioned and the Negro
Woman Ruth to be henceforth discharged from
all services to him or to any persons claiming
under him and the Negro boy Jack to be free
on 1st day of March 1825 according to the Act of
Assembly in such Cases made and provided

James Mshur of Baltimore Town in the State aforesaid  
for divers good Causes and Considerations

emancipate the Negro following to wit, Jenny  
aged about four months to be free from the date  
hereof and her increase to the last generation to be  
free at their Birth hereby acknowledging the said  
Negro discharged from all Claim of Service right  
of property whatever from me my heirs Executors or  
Administrators as Witness my hand & seal this fourth  
day of July in the year of our blessed Lord one thousand and  
eight hundred and one
