 a numerous progeny of the said Doll. in consideration }  
 therefore of the premises I Walter Dulany of the City }  
 of Annapolis do by these presents manumit set }  
 free and discharge from my service and from }  
 the service of all other persons the aforesaid }  
 negroe slave named Doll from the fifth day }  
 of August in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred }  
 and two, on which day the said Doll is hereby }  
 discharged from slavery. In witness whereof }  
 I have hereto set my hand and seal on the fourteenth }  
 day of August in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred }  
 and one.
