Know all men by these presents That ^{to} Negro Benjamin I Walter Dulany of the City of Annapolis in consideration of the Fidelity and attachment which a certain negro slave called Benjamin or Ben. Hanson has evinced I do hereby manumit set free and discharge from my service and the service of all claiming under me the said negro slave Benjamin or Ben from the first day of October in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and nine after which day I do hereby for myself and all claiming under me release and discharge the said Benjamin or Ben Hanson from slavery. In witness where of I hereunto set my hand and seal this 30th day of October in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and one.
