 to } Sundry negroes } that I Walter Dulany of the City of  
 Fidelity and attachment which a certain negroe  
 woman slave called Suckey or Suckey Phanson  
 hath evinced towards my late mother Mrs Mary  
 Dulany do hereby manumit set free and discharge  
 from my service and the service of all persons  
 claiming under me the said negroe woman  
 Suckey and her male child called Thomas from  
 the first day of October in the year of our Lord  
 Eighteen hundred and nine after which day I do  
 hereby for myself and all claiming under me  
 release and discharge the said Suckey and her  
 child Thomas from Slavery. In Witness whereof  
 I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 30<sup>th</sup> day  
 of Oct<sup>r</sup> in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and nine.
