To all whom it may concern, Be it known that for divers good causes and considerations me thereunto moving, I John Pitts of the County aforesaid do hereby manumit and declare free agreeably to the terms hereinafter specified my two negro boys viz. first Ned Guy born about the 10th day of May 1800 to commence free on the 10th day of May 1825. Second James Guy born about the 1st day of October 1801 and in consideration of fifty dollars to me in hand paid by Polley Guy Mother of the said James shall commence free Oct. 1st 1822. until which time he the said James is to remain in the service and at the disposal of the said Polley Guy. Hereby declaring and acknowledging the said negroes aforesaid free and forever discharged from all claim of service right or property whatsoever from me or any claiming under me, my heirs executors, administrators or assigns from and after the expiration of the dates above mentioned.
