



Recorded the 26th day of February 1811.

To all whom it may concern be it known that I Sarah Cord of Anne Arundel County in the State of Maryland for divers good causes and considerations me thereunto moving have and do by these presents manumit liberate and set free from Slavery my negro man ^{called} ~~named~~ Thomas commonly called Thomas Cook and my negro woman called Phebe and do by these presents declare them the said negroes to be free from any further servitude to me my heirs, executors or administrators or any person claiming by from or under me. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 18th day of February in the year eighteen hundred and eleven.
