State of Maryland Anne Arundel county I, Know all Men by these presents that I Horatio S. Gibson of the county aforesaid in consideration of the sum of sixty dollars current money of the United States to me in hand paid by Patty Lee a free black woman at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said Patty Lee her little daughter named Anne, now three years old, To have and to hold the said Anne for and during the term of ten years from the date hereof, and after the said term of ten years is complete and ended, I do hereby declare the said negro girl Anne, the daughter of Patty Lee, to be manumitted liberated and free from all kind of servitude to myself my heirs or assigns, and do hereby warrant and defend the freedom of said Anne against all and every person whomsoever, In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my name and affixed my seal on this twenty fifth day of Jan^y 1811.
