To all whom it may concern be it known, that I Charles Waters of Ann Arundel County, in the state of Maryland, for divers good causes and considerations me therunto moving, as also in further consideration of the sum of five shillings current money to me in hand paid, have released from Slavery, liberated manumitted and set free and by these presents do hereby release from slavery liberate manumit and set free from and after the respective days and times hereinafter mentioned my negro slaves hereinafter named to wit. my Negro Woman Harkey, and also from and after the day ^{of the} date of these presents my Negro man Peter from and after the first day of May in the Year Eighteen hundred and twelve my negro man James from and after the first day of January
