



Know all men by these presents that we Hester Hood and Elizabeth Hood of Anne Arundell County and State of Maryland for divers good causes do manifest and set free our negro slave Anthony after he arrives to the age of thirty years the said negro slave Anthony being of the age of fourteen years. In Testimony whereof we have hereunto set our hands and seals this twenty fifth day of July 1812.
