State of Maryland etc. To all whom it may concern, Be it known that I William Brewer of the city of Annapolis in the State aforesaid having sold to Robert Purviance of the city of Baltimore a negro woman named Sarah alias Sarah Brown for the term of eight years from the twentieth day of March eighteen hundred and thirteen for divers good causes and considerations me thereunto moving as also in further consideration of five shillings current money to me in hand paid have released from slavery after the expiration of said term, liberated, manumitted and set free and by these presents do hereby release from slavery, liberate, manumit and set free the said negro woman named Sarah alias
