

Harwood of Anne Arundel County in the State of Maryland for divers good causes and considerations thereunto moving) as also in further consideration of fifty dollars current money to me in hand paid have released from slavery, liberated manumitted and set free and do by these presents hereby release from slavery liberate manumitt and set free my negro woman named Hannah Young being of the age of forty five years and able to work and gain a sufficient livelihood and maintenance and her the said negro woman named Hannah Young I do declare to be henceforth, free manumitted and discharged from all manner of servitude or service to me my executors or administrators forever. The Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this thirteenth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirteen signed sealed and delivered }
