

respectively his for the purpose above mentioned  
acknowledged before.

Maryland ss. To all whom these presents shall  
come, I Susanna Wyvell of Ann Arundel  
County for divers good causes and considerations  
me thereunto moving, declare free, manumit  
liberate and enfranchise the following negroes  
to wit: Amey to be free on the first day of  
January eighteen hundred and fourteen, Hannah  
aged about forty one to be free on the first  
day of January eighteen hundred and fourteen  
Stacey aged about twenty seven to be free on the  
first day of January eighteen hundred and  
sixteen, Sophia aged about twelve years to be  
free
