To all whom it may concern Be it known
 that I Sarah Riggs of Anne Arundel County
 State of Maryland for divers good causes
 and considerations me thereunto moving

 I do hereby acknowledge and myself
 therewith to be fully satisfied have
 released from slavery liberated
 manumitted and set free my negro man
