To all to whom it may concern Be it known that Anne Lane of Anne Arundel County in the State of Maryland made her last will and testament in writing, dated the thirtieth day of March seventeen hundred and ninety eight which will is legally proved and recorded according to law in the Register of Wills Office for the County aforesaid. And the said Anne Lane did devise under her said will that a certain negro girl by the name of Nell daughter of Bett about two years old should be manumitted and set free. And whereas the said Anne Lane did by her said will authorize and empower John Warren, Estow Sprigg Harwood and Susanna Lane or either of them to manumit
