Lenthicum believing that natural freedom is the right of all men given by Almighty God do bind myself my heirs executors, administrators and assigns to set free and manumit the following negro in the following manner to wit: negro Ripsey aged eleven years to ~~serve~~ nineteen years from the date hereof. Witness my hand, seal this 15<sup>th</sup> day of March 1815.
