 I Minna Pinkney of Annan County in the State of  
 Maryland for times good causes and considerations  
 therein moving as also in further consideration of  
 five dollars current money to me paid in hand  
 have released from Slavery liberated manumitted  
 and set free and by these presents do hereby release  
 from Slavery liberate manumit and set free my  
 negro man named Emance Little being of the age  
 of thirty six years and able to work and gain a  
 sufficient livelihood and maintenance, and him  
 the said negro man named Emance Little I do  
 declare to be henceforth <sup>free</sup> manumitted and discharged  
 from all manner of servitude or service to me my  
 Executors or administrators for ever In Testimony  
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed  
 my seal this 7th day of June in the year of our Lord  
 one thousand eight hundred and nineteen.
