That I John Joseph of said County and State
of Maryland for divers good causes and considerations
and to the intent moving as also in full consideration
of the sum of five hundred pounds money to me in
hand paid, do and have hereby released from
slavery from and after the term of my natural life
or after the time of my natural death liberate
manumitted and set free and by these presents from
and after the term and time aforesaid do hereby
release from slavery liberate manumitted and set free
my negro girl named Fanny (being) of the age of
eighteen years, and any issue she may have during
the time of her servitude, and her the said negro
girl and her issue. I do from and after the term and
time aforesaid declare to be therefore free and
discharged from all manner of servitude or service
to me my heirs my Executors or administrators for
ever In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set
my hand and seal this 27th day of August in
the year of our thousand eight hundred and nineteen
