healthy constitution sound in mind and body and  
capable by her own acquirement to herself sufficient food  
and raiment with other requisite necessaries of life  
from and after the fifteenth day of January in the year  
of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty  
seven. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my  
hand and seal this seventh day of October in the year  
of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and nineteen.
