appears Abraham Ridgely party to the within
instrument appearing before us the subscribers
Justices of the peace of the State of Maryland for
the County aforesaid and acknowledges the
same to be his act and deed for the purposes within
mentioned, and the negro therein named with
her niece to be manumitted and discharged
from all service to him or to any claiming under
him from and after the periods within limited
according to the true intent and meaning thereof
and the acts of assembly in such cases made and
provided

Know all men by these presents that I Juliana
Dunall widow of Nathaniel Dunall late of Anne
Arundel County deceased for divers good causes
and considerations me therunto moving have
manumitted, liberated and set free from slavery
and by these presents do manumitt, liberate and
set free from slavery in manner and form as is
hereinafter set forth a certain negro woman I have
named Jenny now in her twenty third year of
age and her son Isaac and her daughter
Margaret, which said Isaac is now two years
and five months old, and the said Margaret
one,
