 librate manumit and set free from and after the end
 and expiration of eleven years commencing) from the date
 of these presents my negro woman named Mary being
 of the age of twenty years and able to get and a
 sufficient maintenance and do also by these presents
 librate and manumit her issue hereafter to be born of
 males to be free after they shall have attained the age
 of twenty years and if females after they shall have
 attained the age of twenty eight years and the said
 negro woman and her issue do declare to be themselves
 free manumitted and discharged from all manner
 of service to me my Executors or administrators
 from and after the end and expiration of the term and
 ages aforesaid. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand and affixed my seal this sixth day of
 March in the year eighteen hundred and twenty
