To all whom these presents shall come I Jennings & Drury of Anne Arundel County for divers good causes and considerations and the more moving declare free manumitted librated and enfranchised the following negroes to wit, in a former manumission negro Sarah I declare to be free on the first day of March eighteen hundred and twenty seven, she is now about eighteen years of age. I now declare her to be free on the first day of January eighteen hundred and twenty three and her children children to the third generation to be free as follows, males at the age of twenty five years, and females at the age of twenty one, Richard about two years of age to be free on the first day of January eighteen hundred and forty three Thomas aged about three months to be free on the first day of January eighteen hundred and forty five hereby acknowledging the said negroes discharged from all claim of service and right of property whatever from me my heirs Executors and administrators in the premises and from above mentioned Vry Sarah to be free on the 1st day of January 1823 and her issue to be free males at the age of twenty five years and females at the age of twenty one years to the third generation Richard to be free on the 1st January 1843, Thomas to be free on 1st January 1845.
