be thenceforth that is to say from and after the
first day of June eighteen hundred and thirty
three free, manumitted and discharged from all
claims of servitude or service to me my Executors
or administrators forever. and I do hereby declare
for and determine that the State and Condition
of the issue that may be born of the said negro
girl named Ann on or before the said first day
of June eighteen hundred and thirty three shall
be that of free persons entitled to their freedom
from the day of their birth. In Testimony
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
affixed my seal this twenty ninth day of May
in the year eighteen hundred and twenty.
