my negro boy named Jim aged fifteen years; my
negro boy named John aged eleven years; my
negro girl named Jenny aged thirteen years; my
negro girl named Mary aged nine years; my
negro girl named Margaret aged six years; each
and every of them being able to work and gain a
sufficient livelihood and maintenance, and then
the said Jim, John, Jenny, Mary, Margaret
I do declare to be free manumitted and discharged
from all manner of servitude or service to me my
executors or administrators forever from and
after the period herein after named to wit. the
said Jim to be free after the 21st day of June
1835; the said John to be free from and after
the 21st day of June 1839; The said Jenny to be free
from and after the 21st day of June 1835 the
said Mary to be free from and after the 21st day of
June 1839 & the said Margaret to be free from and
after the 21st day of June 1842. In Testimony
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed
my seal this 21st day of June 1820.

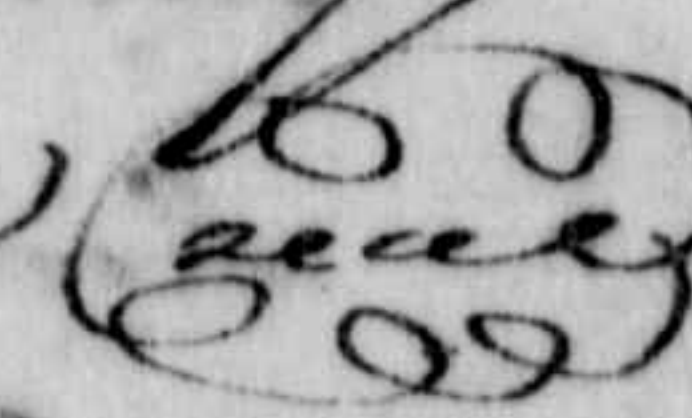
