To all whom it may concern Be it known
that I Eleanor Clark of Anne Arundel County in
the State of Maryland for divers good causes and
therunto moving have released from Slavery
liberated and manumitted and set free and
by these presents do hereby release from Slavery
liberate manumitted and set free my negro
woman Deborah Clark being of the age of
Twenty four years, her the said negro woman
Deborah Clark. I do declare to be free manumitted
and discharged from all manner of servitude
or service her and all her increase to be free to
their latest generations forever from the day
and date hereof. In Testimony whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty
second day of June in the year eighteen
hundred and twenty.
