that I Barn Warfield of said Amherst County
in the State of Virginia for certain good causes and
considerations (set forth more moving) as also in
further consideration of one Dollar in current money
now in hand paid have released from slavery
liberated manumitted and set free, and by these
presents do hereby release from slavery liberate
manumit and set free my negro girl named
Eliza Hallar from and after the twenty first day
of January in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred and thirty six, at which time
the said negro girl named Eliza Hallar if
living will be of the age of sixteen years, and
if during the continuance of the sentence of the
said Eliza Hallar she shall have any issue of
her body begotten, then I do hereby determine
grant and agree that the State or condition of the
said issue shall be that of Freedom and I do
hereby manumit and set free the said said In
Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
affixed my seal this eleventh day of July in the
year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and
thirty six.
