To all whom it may concern Be it known that  
 I Richard Brown of Anne Arundel County in the  
 State of Maryland for divers good causes and  
 considerations and demands moving as also in further  
 consideration of one Dollar sum in hand paid have  
 released from slavery liberated manumitted and  
 set free under by these presents do hereby release  
 from slavery liberated manumitted and set free my  
 negro boy George Smiths being of the age of six  
 years to be free the first day of my eighth  
 summer and truly sound of healthy and sound  
 body and improvable mind, and him the said  
 George Smiths I do declare to be from this time forth  
 free manumitted and discharged from all  
 manner of servitude to me my Executors or  
 administrators forever. In Testimony whereof  
 I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my  
 seal this second day of June in the year of our Lord  
 eighteen hundred and twenty
